

### EYFS: freedom for all

- Children develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and increase their confidence in their own abilities, by taking risks on an obstacle course, mixing colours, talking about their experiences and learning.
- Children reflect on their differences and understand we are free to have different opinions, in small groups they discuss what they feel about transferring in to Year 1.
- We share our WOW moments from at home.
- We play on the climbing equipment in the playground.

### YEAR 1

- We chose our songs for the Christmas carol concert
- We go to football club
- We talk about ourselves in show and tell.
- We bring books in from home for our teacher to read to the class.
- We show our medals in assembly.

### YEAR 2

- At break time and lunchtime, we have freedom. We have dinner choices. We can choose whichever choice we want – A, B or C – or we can have packed lunch.
- We bring certificates or trophies to assembly.
- Clubs - to learn how to cook, because I love football, art club teaches me how to draw; we learn how to speak Spanish.
- Show and Tell medals in class



## Individual Liberty

### YEAR 3

- We are free to choose own friends
- We are free to play own choice of games
- We join our own choice of clubs
- We discuss ideas on what we want to learn

### YEAR 4

- We share achievements from outside and inside school.
- We have a choice about what we play with at lunch and break time.
- We join clubs, depending on our preferences.
- We can share our own experiences from outside school.

### YEAR 5

- We can express our ideas and opinions.
- We can choose the games we want to play at lunchtime.
- We can ask for help whenever we need it.
- There is always someone to talk to if we are sad or worried.
- We can choose from a range of different clubs that suit our interests.

### YEAR 6

- Although we have to wear a uniform, we are free to choose what items we wear as long as they follow the school uniform code.
- We are able to choose who we play with and what we play at lunch and break times.
- We are free to express our opinions without being judged.
